A Bible Study from Hebrews 11

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### Introduction

When the leaders prayed and sought God's guidance and will for his church in 2023 and further, one of the Bible Passages that stood out was the vision God gave Ezekiel (Chapter 47:1-12). God gave this vision to His people when they were at the lowest point in their history. At this point He gave them hope, hope for a new future with God.

God' nation was destroyed, they were in exile, Jerusalem was a wilderness, and the temple was a heap of rubble. Ezekiel has wrestled with how hope can be restored. The only way back is grace. All renewal is in God's hands. All renewal flows from a fresh and powerful vision of God.

God took Ezekiel in the vision to the place of worship, the temple. Ezekiel saw water flowing from below the threshold of the east and the water was flowing down from below the south end of the threshold of the temple, south of the altar. There is hope, because any tiny drop of water, a teardrop of God's grace flowing from the place of prayer and sacrifice is enough. This is living water. Everything in the story

points to the power of the life it holds. It comes from God, from grace alone.

And the water of God's grace continues from His throne of grace, wider and deeper and it transforms even the desert. Wherever the water flowed, lush green trees were growing. That is the effect of the water of life on the desert where nothing normally grows. There is a harvest (not once a year, but) every month! Their fruit will be for food and their leaves for healing.

The river ends in the Dead Sea. The Dead Sea is place where nothing lives. There are no fish. There are no aquatic plants. It is the one place on the entire surface of the planet where there are no plants or animals and no life exists. When a tiny drop of water, this teardrop of God's grace, reached the Dead Sea the waters became fresh, by the power of this living water. There will be plants and fish again in a oncedead environment.

This is the turning point in the imagery/vision. God can overcome even death itself and change everything!

The New Testament points back to Ezekiel 47 with the woman at the well when we read of this living water: "The water I will give will become in them a spring of water – or literally a well of water – gushing up to eternal life," (John 4.14). In John 7:37-39a - On the last and greatest day of the Feast, Jesus stood and said in a loud voice, "If anyone is thirsty, let him come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, streams of living water will flow from within him." By this he meant the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were later to receive."

We are seeking a fresh drop of God's grace on and for our church. We need God's renewing grace and power. It starts with a thirst for more of God. Maybe the spiritual water tank in your life is empty, maybe the waterpipes in your life are blocked by sin, worries, or fleshly issues. We need to remain in the place of prayer and sacrifice and stay long enough to notice what God is doing- the beginning of the river's new life.

In 2023 we are being called to go deeper in our faith and understanding of God's Word. We are called to grow in our understanding of what true worship means, and what it means to be a church where we receive and distribute, healing and restoration.

The aim of this Bible Study is to focus our corporate and individual attention to the things God wants us to pursue, that we may grow deeper in our faith anfn bear much fruit for His glory. We look forward to what God will reveal in the next coming weeks so please share with family, friends and connect groups of how your faith is growing deeper and wider!

## Week 1 – Deeper with God

MEMORY VERSE - Ezekiel 47:12 - Fruit trees of all kinds will grow on both banks of the river. Their leaves will not wither, nor will their fruit fail. Every month they will bear, because the water from the sanctuary flows to them. Their fruit will serve for food and their leaves for healing."

# Introduction to this weeks' study

Ezekiel's vision has a deep spiritual application for us. The river represents the outflowing of the Holy Spirit, bringing life to the lifeless and then in the fruitful trees there are healing powers. God's people who ares nourished by the stream of Holy Spirit, are to produce godly fruit and be a life-giving blessing to others. A godly person who continually thirsts for more of God, will grow spiritually and will bring hope to a world in desperate need of God. This vision reveals God's heart for a broken world and testifies about the gospel of Jesus. God wants us to know his heart and to give us a river of life that flows out to heal our broken hearts and our world.

## Week 2 - True Faith (What is Faith?)

MEMORY VERSE - Hebrews 11:1 - Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see.

## Introduction to this weeks' study

How does one define faith? There are so many views. The memory verse defines it as "being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see." Faith is one of the most important foundations on which the Christian religion is built. Faith is a choice one makes to hold on to God and to blindly trust Him for things we cannot yet see. Faith is trusting God that He is who He says He is, even though I can't see Him and even though it seems to me that God is not going to answer the way I want.

So for me, faith is a firm assurance that the things we are looking forward to will indeed happen. This is the proof that God will make true the things we cannot yet see.

## Introduction to this weeks' study

By faith they accept that something (the big bang) came out of nothing. Every time you step on a plane, you exercise faith in the pilot whom you have never seen. # Introduction to this weeks' study

Noah, the tenth Patriarch of the pre-flood era, was born about 126 years after Adam and would have heard the Creation story from people who knew and spoke directly to Adam! Surely, this would have cemented Noah's faith that God is faithful, just and can always be trusted- no matter the circumstances.

## Week 6 - Obedient Faith

He who had received the promises was about to sacrifice his one and only son, even though God had said to him, "It is through Isaac that your offspring will be reckoned." Abraham reasoned that God could raise the dead, and figuratively speaking, he did receive Isaac back from death.

# Introduction to this weeks' study

God initiated a covenant with Abraham, who came from a idol worshipping background. God initiated this relationship in love and grace, not because of who Abraham was or did. God promised Abraham a glorious future and Abraham had a decision to make. To believe, follow and obey or to ignore God and his commands. # Introduction to this weeks' study

The Bible is clear that in our walk with Christ, our faith will be tested. We must acknowledge this fact and prepare ourselves for these scenarios. The heroes of Hebrews 11 faced an array of diverse challenges. Sometimes they were weakened, sometimes their faith was negatively impacted but God helped them to finish the race and ''pass'' these tests. At the end of our faith journey with God, it is not important what we have accomplished but rather who we believed in, the God who is Supreme and fulfills His promises.
