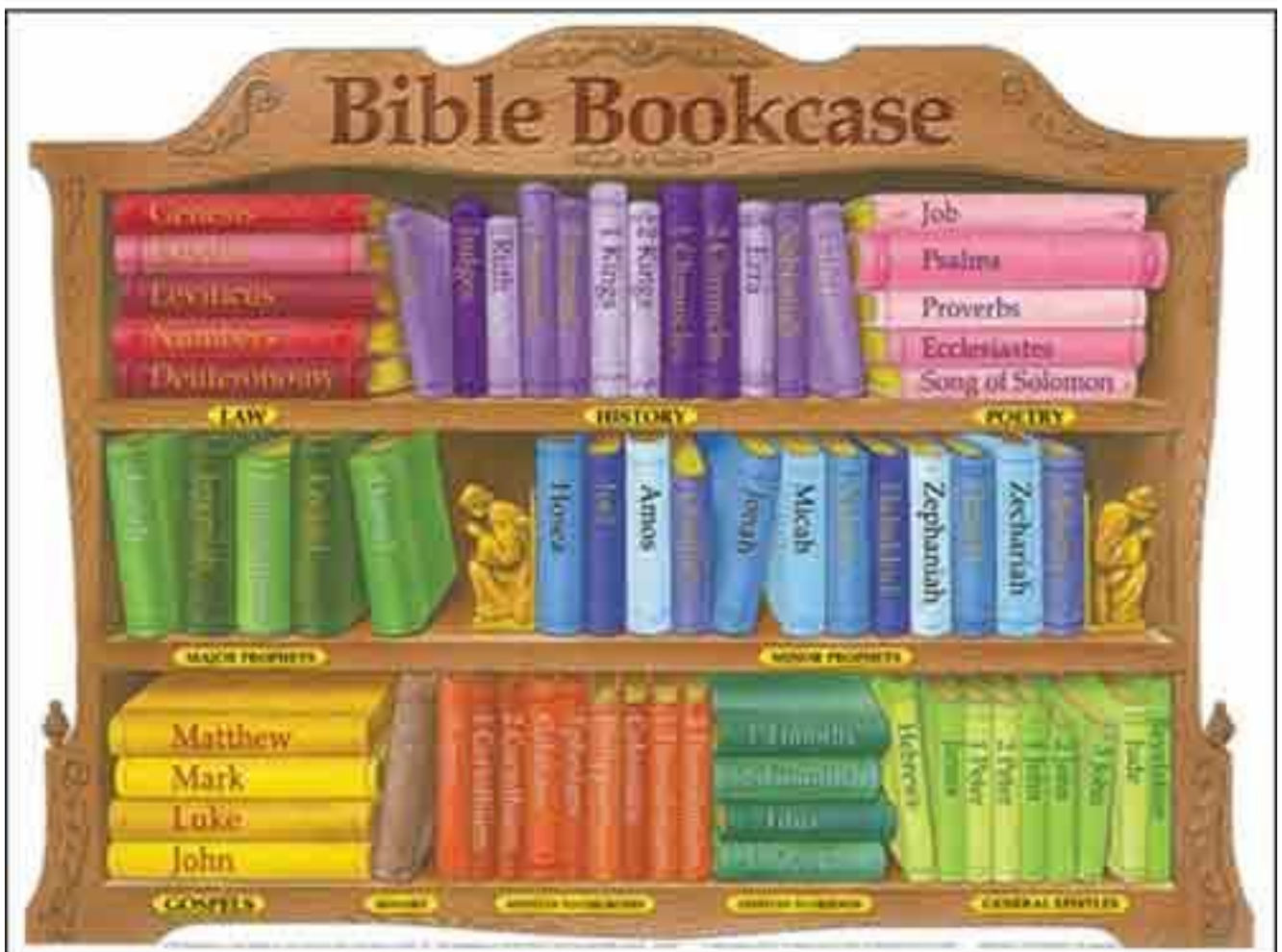

CRAFT—MAKING SCROLLS



Preparations before the lesson:

Create a large scroll of “old manuscript” paper by using a sheet of paper. Crumple the sheet and soak it overnight in a solution of coffee or tea. Lay the soaked page out to dry on newspapers and when dry, iron it. This will give a yellowed, creased look that simulates that of ancient manuscripts. Use two dowels to finish the scroll. You can either prepare a big scroll for everyone to write on, or separate smaller scrolls so that each student has his/her own scroll to write on and take home.

Ask the children about their favourite Bible verse – and allow them to write it on the scroll. If they are too young to write themselves – provide them with different printed bible verses that they can stick onto the scroll.
